

“Learning and teaching Systemic Constellation Work”

– Practice of systemic Constellation Work 2021 –

Constellation work as an established method implies a collection of know-how that is passed on by experienced constellation leaders. Best practices, basics, principles of work, techniques and background knowledge can be acquired at various institutes and from various persons, and further training and specialization in specific procedures and background knowledge are also available. Constellation work – either on a systemic or phenomenological basis or both – is therefore systematically taught in more or less extensive training courses. Meanwhile, overviews, introductions, handbooks and textbooks with instructions how to... have been published. These reference books also make the method manageable for readers and learners.

The book 2021 is dedicated to the topic of teaching and learning Constellation Work, regardless if it is about family or political constellations, systemic structural constellation, or interpersonal trauma. What is helpful from the perspective of contributors to learn or teach if one wants to use Systemic Constellation Work as an approach?

- Reports of aberrations, mistakes, failures and deep conclusions drawn from them
- Learning through and in peer groups and supervision – also beyond the beginning as a facilitator
